2020 RETREAT UPDATE

The AQG 2020 Retreat will be held Monday, April 27 – Friday, May 1, 2020 at Mercy Retreat Center in Auburn. Eleven meals will be provided starting with dinner on Monday night, B, L, D on Tuesday through Thursday, Breakfast on Friday morning. Mercy Center may not be able to accommodate all dietary restrictions. They do have a microwave and refrigerator space available. Rooms are singles that include a sink. Bathrooms and showers are dormitory style.

Registration forms are now available on the AQG web-site. Forms and deposit checks will not be accepted until the September 12 general meeting. Members may make arrangements to bring in <u>one</u> (only) additional registration form and check for a member not able to attend the September meeting. All registrants must be paid current year members as of the August general meeting and also be current paid members at the time of the retreat to attend.

The cost of the retreat is \$420. Members need to bring a 50% deposit (\$210) to the September meeting along with their signed form. Final payment (\$210) will be due at the February 13, 2020 general meeting. Registration will continue until 30 slots have been filled.

If there are slots available after the February 13 meeting, attendance will be opened to non-members. The non-member price is \$440. If necessary, two wait lists will be kept, one for members, one for non-members.
