ZOOM MEETINGS

Alameda Quilt Guild now has a Zoom account and our first Zoom meeting will be Thursday, August 13th. A link containing the meeting ID number will be sent to all members several days prior to the August meeting. No password is needed. If you already have a Zoom account there is nothing more that you need to do prior to the meeting.

If you do not have a Zoom account, this would be a good time to sign up and download the Zoom software. It is free of charge. Desktops and laptops are particularly well suited for Zoom, but tablets and phones can also be used.

Click on the orange button that says Sign up for Free

You will be asked how to join the meeting, so click on "Join with computer audio." If you don't click on this, you will not be able to hear the meeting.

Issues related to large Zoom meetings

Many of you may already be using Zoom to meet with small groups of people. As group size increases, background noise becomes more of a problem. Please be aware that when you join the guild meeting via Zoom, you will be automatically muted. You will be able to hear (and see) the meeting facilitator and the speaker, but any thing you say will be muted.

If you have a question, use the Chat feature at the bottom of the Zoom screen. Chat is just like texting. The facilitator will be monitoring the Chat feature and will try to answer any questions or help with problems. Remember, you will be muted, so if you have a question, use Chat.

You will be able to ask questions of the speaker. We are still working out the best procedure for doing this (for example, using the raise hand feature in Zoom) and there will be complete instructions in the next newsletter.



The Radical Quilting of Rosie Lee Tompkins

A triumphal retrospective at the Berkeley Art Museum confirms her standing as one of the great American artists — transcending craft, challenging painting and reshaping the canon.

In 1997 I walked into the Berkeley Art Museum to be greeted by a staggering sight: an array of some 20 quilts unlike any I had ever seen. Their unbridled colors, irregular shapes and nearly reckless range of textiles telegraphed a tremendous energy and the implacable ambition, and confidence, of great art.

They were crafted objects that transcended quilting, with the power of painting. This made them canon-busting, and implicitly subversive. They gave off a tangible heat. I left in a state of shock — I knew I had been instantly converted but I didn't yet know to what.

In memory the show became a jubilant fugue of small squares of velvet in deep gemstone hues, dancing with not much apparent order yet impeccably arranged for full effect. My first thought was of Paul Klee, that kind of love-at-first-sight allure, seductive hand-madeness and unfiltered accessibility, only bigger and stronger.
